When to use a Visual Resume?

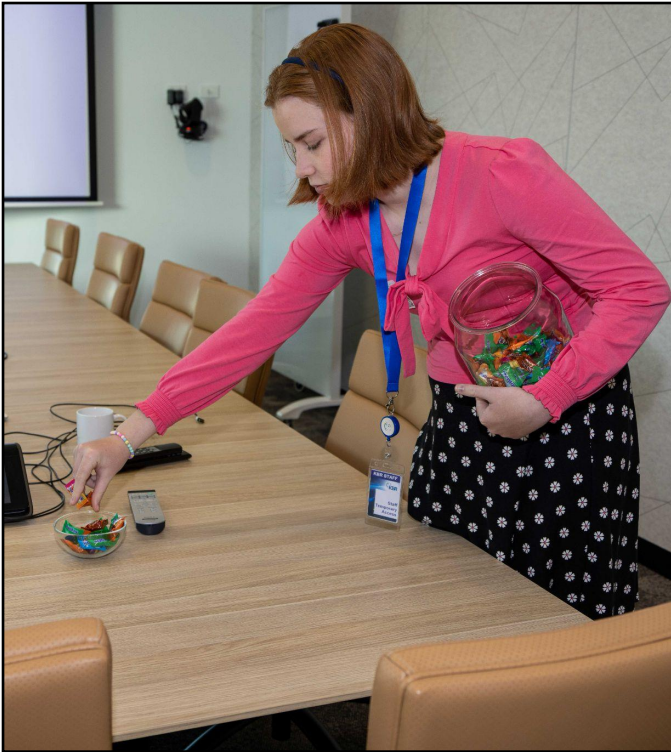
1. Start with Discovery
 - Reflect and observe
 - Create opportunities to explore interests
2. Develop Visual Resume



When to use a Visual Resume?

3. Brainstorm workplaces with others
4. Approach employers
5. Show visual resume and explain concept of customised employment





Key components of a Visual Resume

- Images of competence
- Narrative descriptions
- Task Lists

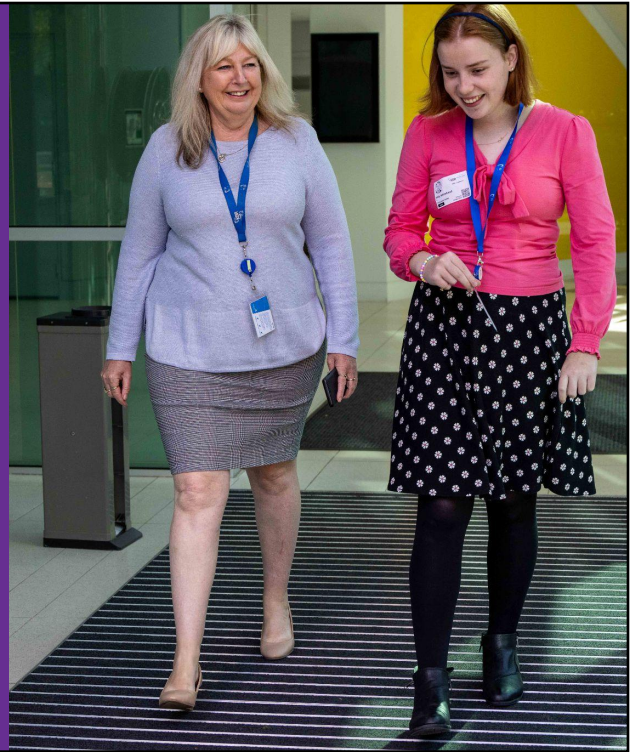
Important Inclusions

1. Font Heading (36-40) Body (24-30) Sans Serif
2. Ideally 1 image per slide
3. Images - person looking at task not the camera
4. Third person
5. 6 - 8 slides



Considerations for developing a Visual Resume
